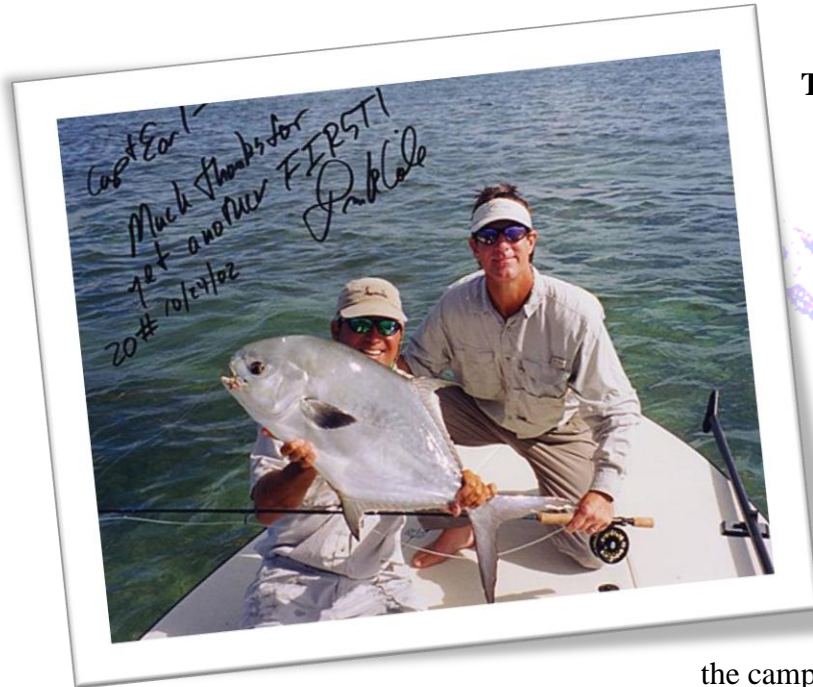


Fly Fishing for Permit in the Florida Keys with Guide Capt. Earle Waters

Weekly Oct 1, 2011 – Oct 31, 2011



Trip Description:

October is the permit month in the lower keys, with very little boat pressure and an excellent time for trophy Permit. Luxury accommodations and crystal clear blue waters, sandy beaches and incredible sunsets round out our permit quest in the Florida Keys.

We will make a run oceanside and to the gulf side each day and will always be running protective waters. Usually you will be fishing within 20-30 min. from the camp. Sight fishing will be the order each

day. The bonus fish and for those who would like to be recognized for catching Grand Slam, there will be the opportunity of catching bonefish and tarpon. In good weather Permit fishing is great, in bad weather permit fishing is great.

Itinerary:

Day 1: Upon arrival in the Keys, your host will welcome you with a cocktail, followed by the issuing of fishing licenses and a presentation of your upcoming itinerary.

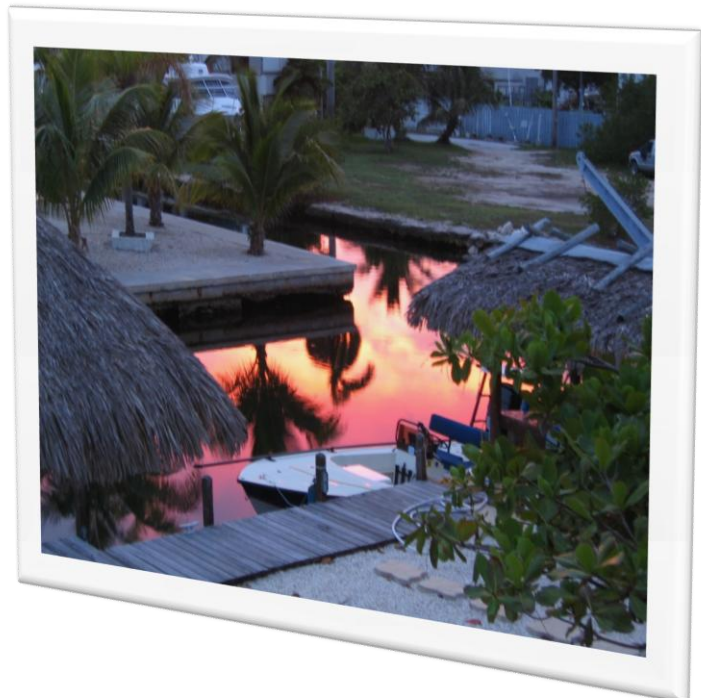
Day 2 -6: Depart for a day of fishing,

Better fly designs, fly lines and just a better understanding of what permit do have made them a very exciting quarry. Their sheer numbers are astounding. Schools of surface swimming fish of a 100 or more is a sight to see. Most of the places we fish in the Keys today are not pressured by other guides and anglers in October, making it equally exciting knowing when you find them, no one else has been pursuing them.

Our private camp is in the lower keys. Couples will stay in the upper level in the permit room. This is the luxury suite, equip with all the amenities needed and a queen size bed. Individuals will be in the bonefish room. Twin beds are the arrangement here. The boat will be only a few feet away. 20% Discount for two anglers sharing guide and accommodations.

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
